

Mastery & Independence are two sections found in the Circle of Courage. We celebrate Mastery not just in terms of academic accomplishments, but physically, spiritually, mentally, and emotionally. Mastery is having self-control and responsibility, and striving not to be superior, but to achieve personal goals.

Independence is making one's own decisions and being responsible for failure or success. It is setting one's own goals and being disciplined. This fits in nicely with our "Own It, Fix It, Change It, Move On" model – where we take ownership of our decisions and work to learn from, improve on, and grow in both our mistakes and our successes.

The tip represents our adulthood. The veins represent the days of our lives and the choices we make. The fluff at the bottom represents infancy and our beginning. The quill represents our inner strength and the path we are on. The feather is divided int two parts. good or bad, right or wrong, and so on. This reminds us of balance

Registration for the 2023/2024 school year is currently underway.

Kindergarten students must be 5 years old by December 31, 2023 to attend. The Pre-K program accepts 3 and 4 year olds, but an application process does take place first as there are limited spots.
