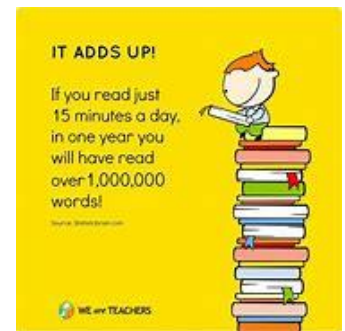


Report Cards Have Been Sent Home – Now What?

Our recent report cards provide a summary of student achievement from September to January. The next report cards will be sent out on June 29th. So much learning will take place over the next five months.

Here are a few tips for parents/guardians to help student academic growth to the end of the school year:

- Set a regular time each evening to read with your child. Even 15 minutes a night adds up to a lot of reading growth.
- When you are watching a TV show or movie ask your child questions: “What do you think will happen next?” “Does this movie remind you of another movie we watched?” “How do you think that character feels right now?” “How do you feel right now?” These types of questions help with reading comprehension.
- Recite addition/multiplication tables when you are driving. Play card games or do puzzles on the weekend.
- Keep an eye on assignments that are being completed by going into the parent portal for your child. Teachers enter assignments/grades regularly.



For more tips, ask your child’s teacher.



Dress for the Weather: We will continue to take outdoor breaks with our students daily, unless the weather is -25°C or colder. Please make sure students come to school prepared for going outside.
