The COVID Virus – School Protocols

This year we will place the health and safety of students, families, and staff at the forefront, continuing many of the protocols we had in place last year.

- All staff and students will continue wearing masks
- Medical grade masks will be provided for all students
- We will practice physical distancing and stay within our classroom cohorts
- Frequent hand sanitizing and washing take place each day
- Regular disinfection of classrooms, bathrooms, and common areas
- We ask that all children who have COVID like symptoms to stay home and consider getting tested for COVID. Students should stay home for 48 hours after symptoms are no longer present.
- We call home if a child becomes sick while at school
